As we continue our Easter Season celebration, we look to Pope Francis and to his Divine Mercy Sunday reflection. If we are truly to follow in the footprints of Jesus, we might want to think about how we exemplify and share His mercy. **How are we being signs of hope and healing in a world that often seems out of control. 

Let us remember the words of Jesus to St. Faustina, the great apostle of today's feast, **"the greater the sinner, the greater the right they have to my mercy."**

Picture God's ocean of mercy, imagine yourself dropped in as a little rock of salt, and dissolve in those faithful words: "**My Lord and my God**, **I trust in you**."

Let us be renewed by the peace, forgiveness, and wounds of the merciful Jesus. Let us ask for the grace to become *witnesses of mercy*. Only in this way will our faith be alive and our lives unified. Only in this way will we proclaim the Gospel of mercy.


