

WHEAT SCATTERED AND SOWN EVENTS

When Jesus walked this earth, many who were ill were thought of as unclean, punished by God, ignored and excluded. The physically broken were literally shunned by society. Jesus, however, had a totally different way, a compassionate way of shattering the norm. Jesus set aside the restrictions of the time and touched, healed, forgave and made people whole again.

As news of Jesus of Nazareth began to circulate, it must have been difficult for Him to be sought after. It must have been difficult for Him to simply walk the streets without the sick and suffering constantly reaching out to Him to be healed. Each day, as He walked the streets of the towns and villages, people clamored to see him, touch Him and beg Him for healing.

Think of how you feel after the challenges of a long hard day. Think about how exhausted you feel. Think of the pressure of deadlines, family obligations, a day when it seems that everyone wants a piece of you.

The second part of the Gospel gives us a glimpse of how Jesus refueled before He ventured out into streets. *"Rising very early before dawn, he left and went to a deserted place, where he prayed."* Jesus knew that He could not do this alone. Jesus went to the Source, His Father. He took quiet time, alone time, prayer time. Once He had reconnected with God, Jesus was again ready. *"Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come."*

Prayer! Reconnecting and refueling with our God. Perhaps that is the example from Jesus that we need. For many of us every day is a day of action. Busy from early morning, on the phone, answering emails, meeting deadlines, noise and pressure. Perhaps this Gospel is God asking **US** to **reconnect and refuel.** Maybe these few weeks before Lent we can get into the routine of taking just a few minutes each day to renew our friendship with God; time in quiet, thankful, restful, healing prayer.
