On this Veteran's Day Weekend, I wish to express my sincere THANK YOU to all the men and women who served in our country's military. You literally personify John 15:13, "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends."

In light of the ongoing wars in the Middle East, Ukraine, and other spots throughout the world, I am taking the opportunity to highlight the Catholic Church's Just War Theory as found in section 2309 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

The strict conditions for legitimate defense by military force require rigorous consideration. The gravity of such a decision makes it subject to rigorous conditions of moral legitimacy. At one and the same time:

- * The damage inflicted by the aggressor on the nation or community of nations must be lasting, grave, and certain.
- * All other means of putting an end to it must have been shown to be impractical or ineffective.
- *There must be serious prospects of success.
- *The use of arms must not produce evils and disorders graver than the evil to be eliminated. The power of modem means of destruction weighs very heavily in evaluating this condition.


